Resource Management Plan (RMP)

The BLM has been working on a management plan for their properties in the San Juan Islands. This will guide us in what we can do at Turn Point. For example, it will possibly allow us to house our docents in the Keepers' Quarters and maybe a campsite for kayakers. (Note: the RMP was approved in early 2023 and is now being implemented).

Restoration

Not much has happened in the historic buildings at Turn Point. The garage is not considered historic as it was built in 1954. The garage door has been a hazard for many years and deteriorating plywood allowed mice to enter. TPLPS proposed to replace it with a modern door and new plywood that resembles the original. BLM – Personnel

BLM – Resource Management Plan (RMP)

Now that the RMP is approved, we need to work closely with BLM to move forward with getting the Keepers' Quarters ready for our docents. This will require drilling a well, constructing a septic system, and rewiring the building. There will also be safety issues to address like emergency exits and fire alarms.
